FEMA funds for Earthquake Damage

Federal money is now available to help eligible displaced individuals in Napa and Solano counties to repair essential living areas damaged by the South Napa earthquake. Apply at the FEMA Disaster Recovery Center at 1155 Capitol Street, open 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. weekdays. Future weekend hours will be determined later.

According to Federal Coordinating Officer Stephen De Blasio, "People can only get federal assistance if they register – that's the only way they can start the process." Individuals should register online at DisasterAssistance.gov, by telephone at 800-621-FEMA (3362), or from smartphone or tablet at m.fema.gov.




CCRC Meetings


