## CCRC Downtown Security Camera Pilot Project

In an ongoing effort to increase public safety and reduce the incidents of crime, CCRC is exploring options to install security cameras in the downtown. The Board is considering a couple of different options such as Amazon's Ring Spotlight Camera and Google's Nest Outdoor Camera. The price points vary slightly with discounts on larger purchases and for a modest monthly fee, data can be stored in the cloud. Although, cameras cannot prevent crime they can act as a deterrent and they can help law enforcement apprehend criminals when a crime is committed.

If the project is successful, more cameras could be added and property and business owners interested could join the network.

As part of the information gathering process, the Board is also developing a survey to poll downtown property and business owners to determine their interest in this project.

Car burglaries increase during the holiday season. You can help secure your vehicle from being broken into by taking these safety precautions:

- Keep the interior of your car free of valuables. Never leave bags, purses, wallets, briefcases, laptops, cell phones, loose change or anything that may be of value to a thief in plain view.
- Hide chargers, and accessories that indicate a GPS, mobile phone, or other device may be stashed in your vehicle.
- Remove garage door openers, key cards, and house or work keys from the car so that a prowler cannot gain access to your home.
- Don't leave credit cards, identification or personal information in your glove box or anywhere in your car.
- If you must leave valuables in your car, put them in the trunk before you arrive at your destination.

## Free Fall Cleanup Day

As a way of providing residents with an affordable and acceptable alternative to illegal dumping, the City of Vallejo will partner with Recology Vallejo for the Third Annual Cleanup Day or “Free Dump Day” event, which will be held on November 3<sup>rd</sup> from 8:00 am – 12:00 pm on Railroad Avenue located on Mare Island. This event is only available to Vallejo residents, rain or shine, and proof of residency will be required. Acceptable proof of residency includes a CA Identification Card (I.D.) or a CA Driver’s License. If the I.D. or license does not reflect a Vallejo address, please supplement the proof of residency with a bill that states the holders name and current Vallejo address.

Residents wishing to participate must enter Mare Island via the Walnut Avenue exit from Highway 37. Staff will then direct residents down Walnut Avenue onto Railroad Avenue where participants will offload and then be guided back onto Highway 37 to leave Mare Island. No one participating in this event will be allowed to enter the line from the Mare Island Causeway Bridge.

In 2017, the Public Works Grounds Maintenance section removed more than 2 million pounds of illegally dumped materials from the streets of Vallejo. During last year’s cleanup event, nearly 200 tons were collected.

Let’s continue to keep Vallejo beautiful!!

### **Greyhound is now Providing Service from the Vallejo Transit Center**

Greyhound bus and SolTrans have partnered to provide service from the Vallejo Transit Center in Downtown Vallejo. The new partnership includes a dedicated bus bay at the transit center with ticketing and information provided at the ticket office. Greyhound services began on September 17<sup>th</sup> with five buses running daily and destinations which include Sacramento, Reno, and San Francisco.

Cal Maritime is leasing 14,000 square feet of space at 253 and 255 Georgia Street. The Cal Maritime Anchor Center will be home to community educational programming and rental space for outside organizations. The space contains a large gathering area for events and two breakout rooms, as well as more traditional classroom spaces with small testing areas. The largest room can accommodate approximately 100 people, depending on configuration and event type.

Cal Maritime President Tom Cropper believes the center will help foster cooperation and collaboration between the City and the Academy.
