How are we funded? We are funded by a special tax assessment which is voted on and approved by downtown property owners, each PBID cycle. The current PBID cycle runs from May 1, 2018 – December 31, 2024.

Purpose: Our purpose is to revitalize and promote the economic well-being of Downtown Vallejo as the main street of commercial and cultural activity that promotes shopping, working, dining, and living in a secure and progressive environment. This is achieved through improvements and activities that include: Beautification, Security, Promotions and Advocacy.

Update from the Pacific Coast Farmers Market Association

At CCRC's general meeting on September 12th, staff from PCFMA gave an update to the board.

Regional Manager, Ben Palazzolo, reported the Vallejo Farmer's Market serves over 50,000 customers per year (averaging 1,400 – 1,500 per week), their marketing and advertising campaign reaches 300,000 people per year and the market redeems \$12,276 in CalFresh, \$5,709 in Market Match, and \$3,883 in WIC benefits annually. These incentive programs benefit local farmers through an increase in shoppers and provide families the opportunity to purchase fresh, locally grown fruits and vegetables. Ben also commented the Vallejo Farmers Market is PCFMA most successful market. Open year round, Saturday from 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. at Marin & Georgia Street.

**Mayor Bob Sampayan Tours San Francisco
Navigation Center in Preparation for
Vallejo Homeless**

On September 16, Mayor Bob Sampayan, Assistant City Manager Anne Cardwell, and Housing and Community Development Manager Judy Shepard-Hall, along with other city and county staff, participated in a tour of the Division Circle Navigator Center in San Francisco. The tour, led by San Francisco Mayor London Breed, served as an opportunity for the Vallejo officials to find out more about the centers operations and methods for serving the SF homeless population.

In May, Vallejo City Council approved the use of Fiscal Year (FY) 2019-20 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program Funding in the amount of \$658,842 for the acquisition and construction of a public facility for a navigation center to address the needs of the homeless population. It is anticipated that the site will serve as a as a one-stop-shop and provide access to medical and mental health services, social services, and temporary shelter.

Last month, City staff identified a potential location for the proposed center. In the coming month, City staff will provide a recommendation to the Vallejo City Council for consideration of the property.
